



Absentee Ballots

Who can vote Absentee?

Any qualified elector may vote an absentee ballot for any election.

How to Request an Absentee Ballot?

- By completing an [Absentee Ballot Application](#) and mailing it to:

- By calling the Board of Elections at 937-642-2836 and requesting an [Absentee Ballot Application](#) be mailed to you
- By mailing a letter to the Board of Elections with the following information:
 1. Voter's Name
 2. Address at which the voter is registered to vote
 3. Date of Birth
 4. Voter's signature (May not be signed by Power of Attorney unless voter has an Attorney in Fact form filed with the Board of Elections).
 5. One of the following:
 - a. Voter's drivers license number
 - b. Last 4 digits of the voter's Social Security Number
 - c. A copy of the voter's current and valid photo Id, a copy of a military id that shows the voter's name and current address, or a copy of a current utility bill, bank statement, government check, paycheck, or other government document that shows voter's name and current address.
 6. Election for which the Absentee Ballot is requested for.
 7. A statement that the voter requesting the ballot is a qualified elector.
 8. If a request for a Primary Election, the voter's party affiliation.
 9. Address where the ballot is to be sent if different than the voter's address.

Please print and sign your request. If more than one voter in a household requests a ballot, we must have the signature and above information for each person.

2012 Mail-in Application Deadlines

Election

Must be Received at Board of Elections by:

March 6th Primary Election

Saturday, March 3rd by 12:00 Noon

November 6th General Election

Saturday, November 3rd by 12:00 Noon

2012 Mail-in Ballot Deadlines

March 6th 2012 Primary Election

Mail – Postmarked by March 5th and received by March 16th.

In-Person – Received at Board of Elections Office by close of polls on March 6th, 7:30 PM.

November 6th 2012 General Election

Mail – Postmarked by November 5th and received by November 16th.

In-Person – Received at Board of Elections Office by close of polls November 6th, 7:30 PM.

Absentee Ballots maybe hand delivered to the Board Office by the voter or by a relative of the voter.
